Principal's Message

Another year has turned over and we are almost one month into 2018. We get to look forward to one more week of this year's version of January weather. Soon we will have the long awaited appearance of the February rodent.

We again ask parents to monitor what their children are doing when on the internet. Issues that come to the school between students usually begin with inappropriate exchanges on Facebook or other social media. The issues carry into the school and become a school issue. In most cases to date, after investigation it is found that there is equal exchange by all students involved. Either student may serve as the instigator but both take equal parts.

Parents are provided with the ability to check on student marks, assignments and attendance through the use of the Parent Portal found on the school division website. Parents can see marks awarded on assessments and any assignments that have not been handed in for assessment. These marks are to be regularly updated for a recent view of student performance, any concerns regarding student performance or regular updating should be addressed to the teacher of the particular courses. Parents can gain access to the Parent Portal by contacting the school and asking the Secretary to set them up with a User Identification and a password.

With the closing of this month of January, the students in the High School are preparing for the examinations. There are only two days for exams required. As all the morning classes continue for the

year they do not require a final examination at this time. Only the afternoon classes run for one semester and require either a final exam or a final project. It is the afternoon courses that have slotted times for exams during the examination time period. This term the high school examinations will be written in the individual classrooms.

Regular class instruction continues until Jan 30. The examination time period runs during the afternoon of January 30th and all day January 31. The semester break is on February 1. February 1 is an administration day for teachers to mark exams and to complete report cards.

The elementary side of the school has been able to go outside on particular days in January because the usual cold weather is not present. Students from K to 6 do not go outside for recess if the temperature or winds chill is -26 degrees or less. They do go out for varied and limited amounts of time when the temperature or wind chill range between -20 to -25. The decision regarding outside recess for all temperatures and weather conditions is based on the conditions at the time of the recess breaks.

In February, we will be setting up courses and schedules for next year. Before courses are selected by students there is a scheduled night for parents and students to hear about possible courses and timetable arrangements. After Feb 6, students will be asked to choose courses from a list of possible courses to determine what may be offered during the 2017/2018 school year.



Have a great month! Letters and flyers will be coming home soon with information about the book fair, see you there!




News from the Grades 5 & 6 Room
