We will have 2 more social studies units and one science unit remaining after we finish the unit on fluids! Art has continued to be reflective of our topics in social studies as well.

The month of February was a fast and fun month. We were busy doing I Love to Read, where we were very lucky to have a guest reader come into the school. Skating was a very busy and exciting time at the rink. Once the weather cooperated and got a little bit colder, the ice was ready to be used. All of the students were very happy to get away from the gym for a few classes.

We were busy learning 4 digit multiplication and division in grade 5 as well as learning to read line graphs in grade 6. We enjoyed the last unit but most students were quite happy to move onto new material.

Our ELA project is a biography about an individual with the same last name but not a relative. This required a lot of research, writing, and students discovered several unique facts about their families and individuals who shared their last name.

Social Studies was very busy with several presentations on both World War 1&2. This was an exciting assignment for the students because it included several local CAF members being researched as well as quite informative to the students who were unaware of the sacrifices and events that took place during the war.

Our science unit on flight has been exciting, fun and eventful. The students have learned about lift, drag, gravity and thrust. All very important factors needing to be included in order for flight to occur. They were able to learn more by doing a lot of experiments such as constructing hot air balloons, kites, and paper air planes. The next project will require students to construct a device that is powered by a propeller.

Now that March is here we expect to see a rapid change in the weather from one week to the next. This will allow our class to venture outside more often and perform multiple experiments. Please make sure that students are continuing to dress appropriate for the weather to avoid missing out on any outdoor events.

With the new semester starting, we have started a new course called Visual Arts 10S, and Grade 11/12 Physical Education. The Grade 9's have learned the elements and principles of art. For the Grade 11/12 physical education, we played some volleyball and went out to the shed to do some workouts and use weights.

In the world of Junior Sports, the kids have started both basketball and curling. Divisional for basketball is on March 4th, with the guys going to Ste. Rose, and with the girls hosting at Alonsa. For curling, it will be on March 7th at the McCreary Curling rink.

The next sport for Senior sports is Badminton. Practices will be starting up right away with the first days of games starting March 13th in Alonsa.

Room 9 News by Mr. Reimer

The Grade 11 Essential Math students began second semester by studying the unit Interest and Credit. In this unit students have been learning about simple and compound interest, calculating personal loans, credit cards, buy-now-pay-later plans, and installment buying options. With this unit coming to an end shortly, the next unit of study will be Surface Area.

Quadratic Functions and Equations have been the focus for the Grade 11 Applied students. In this unit students have been learning about exploring quadratic relations, solving quadratic equations with factoring, as well as, using the quadratic equation. The next unit will be Inductive and Deductive Reasoning.

In Grade 10 Essential Math the first unit of study was Personal Finance. This unit focused on calculating gross pay, net pay, and other forms of income such as commission, piece work and contract work. The class has recently been learning about Consumerism and Travel. This second unit teaches students about unit price, currency exchange, and measurement conversions. The third unit of study will be Measuring Length.

The Introduction to Applied/Pre-Cal. Grade 10 Math class have studied Measuring Systems and Surface Area and Volume. In the first unit, Measuring Systems, si measurement, imperial measurement, and converting between the two systems was taught. In the second unit, students have been learning about how to calculate the surface area and volume of various shapes. The next unit will be Right Triangle Trigonometry.

The Grade 9 Business and Innovation class, students have been introduced to the world of business. In this unit students have been learning about how business are born, how they operate, as well as the hierarchy within a business to help it operate efficiently.

In the Chemistry 40S class, students began the semester studying Aqueous Reactions. In this unit students have been learning about the types of reactions that take place in aqueous solutions. They also have been learning about oxidation and reduction reactions, as well as how to balance redox equations.


