October has come and gone and we had such a productive month. Grade 5/6 students were buys learning lots, working together, and completing multiple assignments.

In **math**, we learned several outcomes; place value, integers, decimal representation and ratios. The students have been working extremely hard, both in small groups and independently. I am very impressed with their work ethic and their ability to adapt when one class is learning separately from the other.

Our **ELA** has seen a vast improvement for all our students, with a big focus on grammar, sentence structure, writing compositions, and spelling. Since we started this school year, our students have all done a fantastic job and they are slowly starting to enjoy writing and grammar.

We have studied the Diversity of Living Things in **science** and have learned about the 5 kingdoms to classify living things. Students enjoyed learning the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates and examples in their life.

We are currently learning about the British North America Act and the foundations it laid for the creation of the federal system and eventually provincial and municipal government. Next, we will learn about the National Policy and its impact on growing Canada.

# **NEWS FROM MS. DORAN**

It is hard to believe that we have flew through a second month of school! The Grade 6B math class has been very busy, learning about integers, mixed numbers, improper fractions, and proper fractions. They have made a lot of progress with these topics in the last few weeks! The Grade 7 group has also been working on adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators in the first couple of weeks in November.

The Grade 8's have been hard at work as well. They absolutely flew through the chapter on fraction operations, where they have demonstrated their ability to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions of all types. We are currently working on linear relations, or graphing straight lines and the many patterns involved with this topic. Grade 8's have also started learning about the rock cycle, which will then turn into a focus on various topics related to soil and resources found in the earth during science.

Grade 9's have been learning about solving equations and will be doing some work on linear relations and linear equalities in the coming weeks. The goal is to get as much of the grade 9 math material covered by the end of December as possible to maximize amount of time students have in January to focus on new material.

I also had the opportunity to coach the junior soccer team this year. Thank you to all the students who showed up to our lunch time practices and the divisional soccer day. The weather was on our side this year, and while it was not the warmest day, the sun was still shining!

There will be a Remembrance Day Service held at the school on Friday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. Doors will open at 10:30 for any members of the public that wish to attend, and the ceremony is scheduled to begin at 10:45 AM.

# **CLASSROOM 8 NEWS**

It's almost unbelievable that October has almost disappeared!

ELA 40S Comprehensive have finished their Short Stories unit and are beginning to work on a Visual Communication unit. Gr. 12s will be looking at and analyzing visual images, photographs, cartoons, paintings along with writing pieces. They will be considering the relationship of visual works with the written communication along with techniques used in visual works that correlate with written communication.

ELA 30S are continuing with their novel study: Code Talker. Journals and discussion of the novel are almost completed and the Gr. 11s will be concluding with formal essay writing. Drama 45S have completed three major units on the technical aspects of theatre. They have completed a major project on Costume Design Creation and will be presenting their next major Costume and Makeup project on "Romeo and Juliet: The Updated Version set in a Modern-Day High School". Will Romeo be the high school athlete and Juliet the high school popular girl? Will Romeo be the high school rebel and Juliet the high school nerd? Looking forward to seeing the presentation creations.

Reading is Thinking 10S have completed Unit 1: Self-Examination/Self-Reflection with their personal reflection response assessment based on their own personal experiences with reading, insights into what they learned about literacy and their own reading attitudes along with the benefits of reading gained from the power point presentations. Unit 2 will focus on Reading Strategies for Fiction and Non-Fiction.

**ELA 8 students** have started their novel study: Tuck Everlasting and are currently working on general skills of vocabulary and comprehension. Gr. 8 students will be analyzing character, inferences, figurative language, and theme. Culminating assessments will center on argumentative essay writing and creating a song for the novel.

# Room 9 News by Mr. Reimer



The Grade 12 **Essential Math** students began the month of October learning about Geometry. Parallel line, angles, properties of quadrilaterals and triangles, as well as how to solve for the central angle and the sum of interior angels were some of the topics learned in this unit. Students then moved on to Trigonometry. Sine, Law and Cosine Law are the topics primarily studied in this unit. Precision measurement is the unit students get to look forward to next.

Logic and Reasoning was one of the units studied in October in the Grade 12 **Applied Math** class. Students learned about set theory, conditional statements, and applications of logic. Functions is the current unit being taught. Characteristics and application of polynomial, exponential, and logarithmic functions are the topics taught in this unit.

Grade 10 **Science** students are coming near the end of the Chemistry unit. In this unit students have been learning about the periodic table, acids and basis, balancing chemical equations, and how to safely conduct experiments. The Physics unit titled "In Motion" will be the next unit of study. In this unit students will be learning about force, uniform motion, momentum, and how to calculate breaking distance.

In Interdisciplinary Topics in Science 40S students have been researching The Evolution of the Human Species: Where Did We Come From? In this unit students have been researching a variety of origin stories of how life possibly began on this planet. They also have been looking at the history of humans. This unit will be coming to an end in a week or two. Looking forward to the next unit students would like to research.


